### PROHIBITION ON IMPORT, DISTRIBUTION, SALE OR OFFER FOR SALE OF EMERGING TOBACCO PRODUCTS

The Ministry of Health (MOH) is banning emerging tobacco products as a pre-emptive measure to protect public health against the known and potential harms of such products. This will be done via the Prohibited Tobacco Products Regulations under Section 15 of the Tobacco (Control of Advertisements and Sale) Act (Chapter 309).

With effect from <u>15 December 2015</u>, it will be an offence under the Tobacco (Control of Advertisements and Sale) (Prohibited Tobacco Products) Regulations 2015 to import, distribute, sell or offer for sale the below emerging tobacco products:

- a) Smokeless cigars, smokeless cigarillos or smokeless cigarettes;
- b) Dissolvable tobacco or nicotine\*;
- c) Any product containing nicotine or tobacco that may be used topically for application, by implant or injected into any parts of the body\*; &
- d) Any solution or substance, of which tobacco or nicotine is a constituent, that is intended to be used with an electronic nicotine delivery system or a vaporizer (commonly referred to as e-cigarettes.)

Companies may contact the Tobacco Regulation Branch of the Health Sciences Authority (HSA) at 6684 2036/2037/2045 during office hours (Monday to Friday, 9:00am – 5:30pm) should they have any information on such illegal activities or if they require any clarifications.

### **Support For National Service At The Workplace**

Operationally ready national servicemen (NSmen) make up 30% of the 12,000 SATS Ltd staff in Singapore. The company has implemented certain practices to help them manage both their work and NS commitments. For going the extra mile, SATS was conferred the Total Defence Awards awarded to individuals, businesses organisations for their or exemplary support towards total defence, and in particular, NS.

SATS supports their NSmen employees in their duties because a strong defence force and national security are important for a stable business environment, explains SATS Senior Vice President of Human Capital, Ms Lilian Tan. She says, "We see it as our responsibility to help them manage both their work and NS commitments well."

SATS currently has roster planning for shift work, to ensure that those who complete their In-Camp Training (ICT) have sufficient rest before returning to work. Employees who have completed at least two full years of NS are also entitled to an additional monthly allowance of S\$200. In addition, SATS has a workplace health programme, which includes fitness classes and health coaching to encourage employees to stay fit and lead a healthy lifestyle.

Ms Tan has observed that these practices have nurtured a sense of shared responsibility among staff, including non-NS employees. She adds, "Teamwork is also strengthened in the process with everyone working together to manage the workload in their colleague's absence".

Head of Client Relations of SATS Catering, Mr Mark Brown, feels that such support is important for NSmen. "My colleagues have been very reassuring and this allows me to focus on my ICT knowing that my work load is in good hands", he says.


It has also been observed that these practices have given the company an edge in attracting and retaining talent. "Both existing and potential employees will see it as an added incentive to consider SATS as their employer of choice," added Ms Tan.

Ms Tan encourages other companies to similarly show support for NS, believing that it is "imperative for companies to support their NS employees in fulfilling their duties".





### Guangzhou Municipal Commission of Commerce Visit

Guangzhou Municipal Commission of Commerce Visit



On 5<sup>th</sup> November 2015, twenty delegates from the Guangzhou Municipal Commission of Commerce visited the Changi Airfreight Centre. The objective of their visit was to learn and understand about air cargo business development in Singapore, logistics and transport services, cooperation between port and shipping logistics, as well as trade and business with Chinese enterprises, especially Guangzhou City. The visit to the Changi Air Freight Centre has also involved meetings with CAG, SATS and DNATA.
