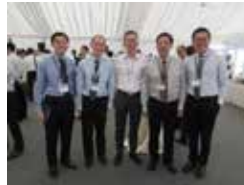

The Ground Breaking of JTC Logistics Hub @ Gul



Industrial landlord JTC Corporation is building the first of its kind next-generation facility known as the JTC Logistics Hub @ Gul. The multi-tenanted facility will comprise of a multi-story inland container depot, warehouses and a heavy vehicle park. It is expected to be completed in 2019.

In a move to boost innovation and efficiency within the logistics industry, the new JTC Logistics Hub will help reduce transport cycle and benefit especially small and medium-sized logistics companies.

Government Events – Singapore Customs

Collaborating with industry partners to build the National Trade Platform

The National Trade Platform (NTP) project team met with over 250 individuals from more than 130 companies across the trade and logistics community to understand the key challenges faced by these businesses today.

Through a series of industry interviews, ideation workshops – during which participants generate and share creative solutions to challenges - and briefings, the team gathered traders' views on the planned features of the NTP, identified opportunities for new platform services, and learnt about the concerns of the trade and logistics community.



Over 40 industry interviews were held from June to August this year and with the feedback gathered, the NTP team ran five ideation workshops in August.



In each workshop, participants included industry players, developers, and small and medium-sized enterprises. They filled coloured sticky notes with a multitude of ideas – different colours represented how challenging each solution would be to implement.



Two briefings were also conducted in September to inform existing TradeXchange users what to expect from the NTP and the transition leading up to the launch next year. Close to 120 representatives from 50 companies attended the sessions at Revenue House.

PROTECTING PERSONAL DATA IS YOUR BUSINESS



Gain the trust of your customers and employees with proper protection of personal data


Does your organisation ask for customer or employee personal details such as names, contact numbers and identification numbers? If so, you are collecting personal data.

All organisations, including small and non-profit entities, need to comply with the Personal Data Protection Act (PDPA), which governs the collection, use and disclosure of personal data.

WHAT DO ORGANISATIONS HAVE TO DO?

- Step 1 - Appoint a data protection officer
- Step 2 - Implement data protection processes

Collection, Use and Disclosure of personal data


- 
1. Decide what personal data you need to collect.
 2. Notify individuals of the purposes and get consent.
 3. Make sure your agents and partners comply with the PDPA.

Access and Correction of personal data

1. Establish a standard process for handling requests for access and correction.
2. You should act on the request within 30 days of receiving it.

Care of personal data

1. Keep the personal data safe.
2. Transfer personal data to another country only if the standard of protection provided is comparable to the protection under the PDPA.

- 
1. Don't collect personal data which you do not need.
 2. Don't use an individual's personal data for a new purpose unless you have obtained consent. This includes existing personal data that you have already collected.

1. Don't give access to an individual if providing the personal data could, for example:
 - harm the individual's safety or physical or mental health;
 - reveal personal data about another individual.

1. Don't retain personal data when it is no longer necessary for any business or legal purpose.

CATCH A GLIMPSE OF WHAT NSMEN DO DURING ICT

On 22 Sep 16, by invitation of Chief Engineer Officer, COL Ong Yoke Lam Melvin, 105 employers had the unique opportunity to visit Seletar Camp and experience what NSmen do when they are called back for In-Camp-Training (ICT) with the Singapore Combat Engineers.

Ms Pauline Tok and Ms Pammie Loh from SAAA@Singapore were two of the 105 employers who witnessed NSmen constructing the Mobility 3rd Generation (M3G) Military Raft, and “cruised” along Punggol Seletar Reservoir on the raft.



This was followed by a tour of the Medical Centre, where they had a first-hand appreciation of how seriously the SAF takes each soldiers' health and safety. They had a chance to see how the SAF medical centres are equipped with Body Cooling Units to provide immediate treatment and stabilise heat-related conditions before evacuation to hospitals.



After the tours, Ms Tok and Ms Loh joined the NSmen at the cookhouse for lunch and experienced an NSman's mealtime. They queued to collect their meals together with the NSmen, and subsequently return their used crockery and cutlery to the designated collection points.



From the visit, Ms Tok and Ms Loh were more cognizant of the resourcefulness and creativity of Combat Engineers. When training and performing operations, they overcome obstacles and advance troops effectively, efficiently and safely. When challenged with unforeseen circumstances, they think on their feet for solutions to achieve their mission. The SAF imbues resourcefulness, creativity and resilience in NSmen. Not only will the NSmen transfer such values and skill sets to their workplace, they can also positively influence their colleagues and peers, thus engendering a positive work culture in their company.

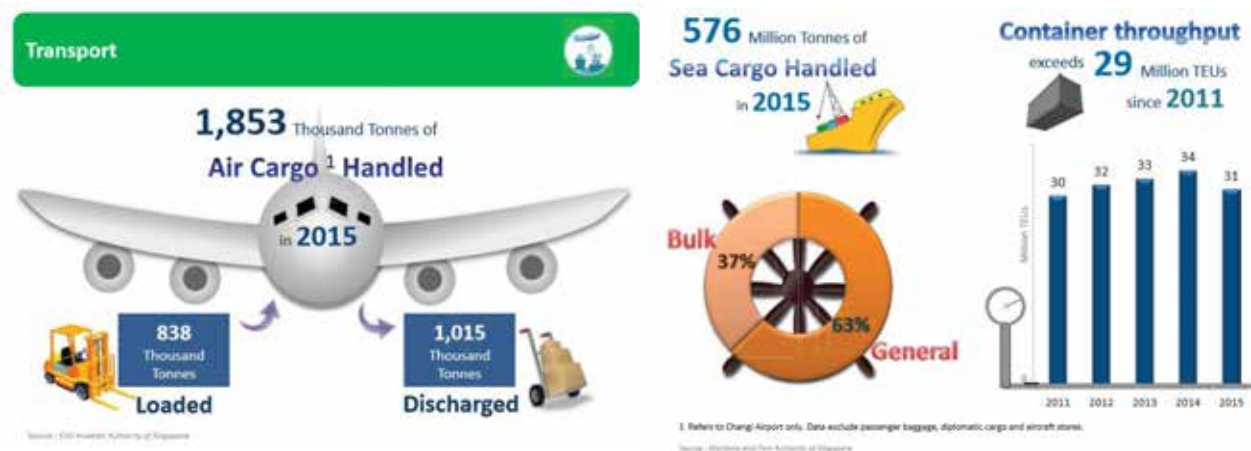

Pave Ahead 2017 and Beyond

On 24 November 2016, over 60 attendees gathered for SAAA Seminar held at Singapore EXPO's Convention Wing, Max Atria. It was themed 'Pave Ahead 2017 and Beyond'.

Mr Paul Teo, Deputy Chairman of SAAA@Singapore, delivered the welcome address and highlighted on the importance of speed to continue the momentum into 2017 for our industry's future development.

Mr Sahril bin Mahmood, the Head of Business Innovation Branch, Singapore Customs gave a presentation on 'Building a New National Trade Platform (NTP): A Vision for the Future of Singapore Trade', covering the next-generation, open innovation platform which coordinates and facilitates trade and information sharing.

He shared on key functionalities driving synergies between NTP and available value-added services such as the advanced HS Classification Engine and Developer's Sandbox and Data Library. A number of key benefits were highlighted which included facilitated configuration, guided onboarding and establishment and renewal of partnership.

Pave Ahead 2017 and Beyond

Mr Ng Chin Beng, Project Manager, SAAA@Singapore, shared with the audience on the Air Cargo Terminal Shuttle (ACTS) project.

ACTS project aims to optimize the outbound supply chain at Changi Airfreight by streamlining the delivery of loose export cargo from airfreight forwarder's facilities to the freight terminals.

Currently, there are 34 forwarders signed up for the ACTS project.

Mr Chiu Wen Tung, URA Acting Group Director (Research & Development) delivered the opening address and spoke on of Changi East Study, part of a Multi-Agency Freight Project between URA, JTC and LTA, in partnership with the Singapore University of Technology and Design (SUTD), and the Singapore-MIT Alliance for Research and Technology (SMART) and SAAA@Singapore. The study is a research to garner information which will help to guide the planning and provision of future infrastructure and freight-friendly policies by the government agencies to facilitate more efficient logistics and transport operations for business operators in the future.

Mr Chiu also introduced the Pilot Commodity Flow Survey that will be rolled out as part of the study to collect key data on companies' goods movement, supply chain model, trip generation, vehicle fleet profile and utilisation rate. He highlighted that survey inputs from companies located in the East Region are particularly important, as it will be used to support planning of key infrastructure for more efficient logistics and transport in East Region.

Dr Lynette Cheah, Assistant Professor, SUTD, shared further details on the different survey sections. Upon completion of survey, participants will receive an executive summary containing analyses of freight movements and logistics industry characteristics in the East Region.

Overall, the Forum provided attendees with opportunities for networking and exchanging of information on the National Trade Platform, ACTS Project, as well as the Changi East Study.

Air Cargo Terminal Shuttle : ACTS of Cargo-Pooling

ACTS project aims to optimize the outbound supply chain at Changi Airfreight by streamlining the delivery of loose export cargo from airfreight forwarder's facilities at ALPS, CAC CAB C, D, E and Megaplex to the airfreight terminals at SATS and dnata Singapore. Currently, there are 4 shuttle on Monday to Friday, and 2 shuttles on Saturdays. There is free activation of Sunday and Public Holiday shuttle service for participating forwarders with monthly 40,000 kg volume.

ACTS project started on 1st Aug 2016, and now there are 34 participating forwarders. Below are some comments from our participants.

"I am glad you had introduced ACTS to our company. This service has resolved our manpower issue which we had been facing all this while. Besides, it also provide us with consistency as well as smooth handling. We certainly hope that ACTS could extended their services for inbound clearance as well."

SPRING Singapore has a grant support package for SME forwarders to encourage early adoption. First 20 SME get 70% grant support for 12 months, and the next 15 SME for 9 months, and the next 15 SME for 6 months. All capped at 60,000 kg per month. The first 10 non-SME get 30% discount for 12 months usage, capped at 60,000 kg per month.
